Annual Performance Plan (A.P.P.'S) Community Priorities (April 2019 - March 2020)

Community approved Objectives/Initiatives are:

- (1) Enhancing Road Safety – Traffic Enforcement & Education.
- (2) Police-Community Relations – Involvement with Youth/Children.
- (3) Drugs

Notable Occurrences for the Month:

The District Annual Performance Plan (APP) initiatives have been named:

Advancement of Road Safety Through Enhanced Training & Strengthened Partnerships

1. Officers required to complete the RCMP Impaired Driving Investigators Course.
2. Officers to receive Drug Impaired Driving presentation from a Drug Recognition Expert.
3. Review of District traffic equipment and training to identify what is needed and implement.
4. Increased partnerships between Detachment officers and District Traffic Services officers for joint team enforcement operations.

Enhance positive relationships with youth

1. Increase school visits in all areas to develop trust with youth and children.
2. Increase officer involvement in community activities geared toward youth.

Support collaborative harm reduction initiatives to combat opioid drug use

1. Increased media releases on dangers of drug use to get information out to the public.
2. Meetings with community partners to open discussions concerning drug abuse.
3. Work with community groups to develop strategies to address drug concerns.

Glovertown Detachment has received a new police vehicle. Our old Chevrolet Tahoe has been replaced by a new Ford Explorer Police Interceptor. Along with this we have also acquired a new, top of the line radar unit to replace an older model. All RCMP vehicles in the area have also had new in-car cell phones with stronger signal boosters installed to increase communications in areas where the older models were unable to operate before, enhancing officer safety.

From May 6th – 10th, a Glovertown officer joined the B Division Tactical Troop in St. John's for training and is now a full member of that team. Also during May, another member of our team was selected to join the B Division Emergency Response Team (ERT). Congrats to both these members on their accomplishments.

May 14th to the 20th was Canada Road Safety Week. Glovertown Detachment members hit the roads in full force and did quite well laying a substantial number of charges and seizing several vehicles.

Upcoming Community Policing Activities or Events

The “Wanted Board” has gone up in the foyer of Glovertown Detachment. New posters are going up on a regular basis. Anyone with outstanding arrest warrants out of our Detachment will be posted. If anyone has any information on the whereabouts of a wanted individual, please contact the Detachment. Thank you!
